

OUTCOME CC9.2

Analyze and express one's own understanding of how societal and economic needs influence the nature of paid and unpaid work.

GOAL

All students will explore the connection between learning and work pathways and their connections to community.

UNDERSTANDINGS

1. Students will understand that each community has its own set of needs and trends which affects the type of paid and unpaid work/jobs available so that they may select a community to live which fits with who they are and what they would like to be.
2. Students will understand that each community has a set of social and economic needs upon which jobs or work are created so that they can connect their personal pathway to an appropriate community.
3. Students will understand that jobs of work available in a community can change because of certain trends so that they are able to best predict and adjust to job trends in their community
4. Students will understand the importance of contributing to community through paid and unpaid work so that they may positively affect their community today and tomorrow.

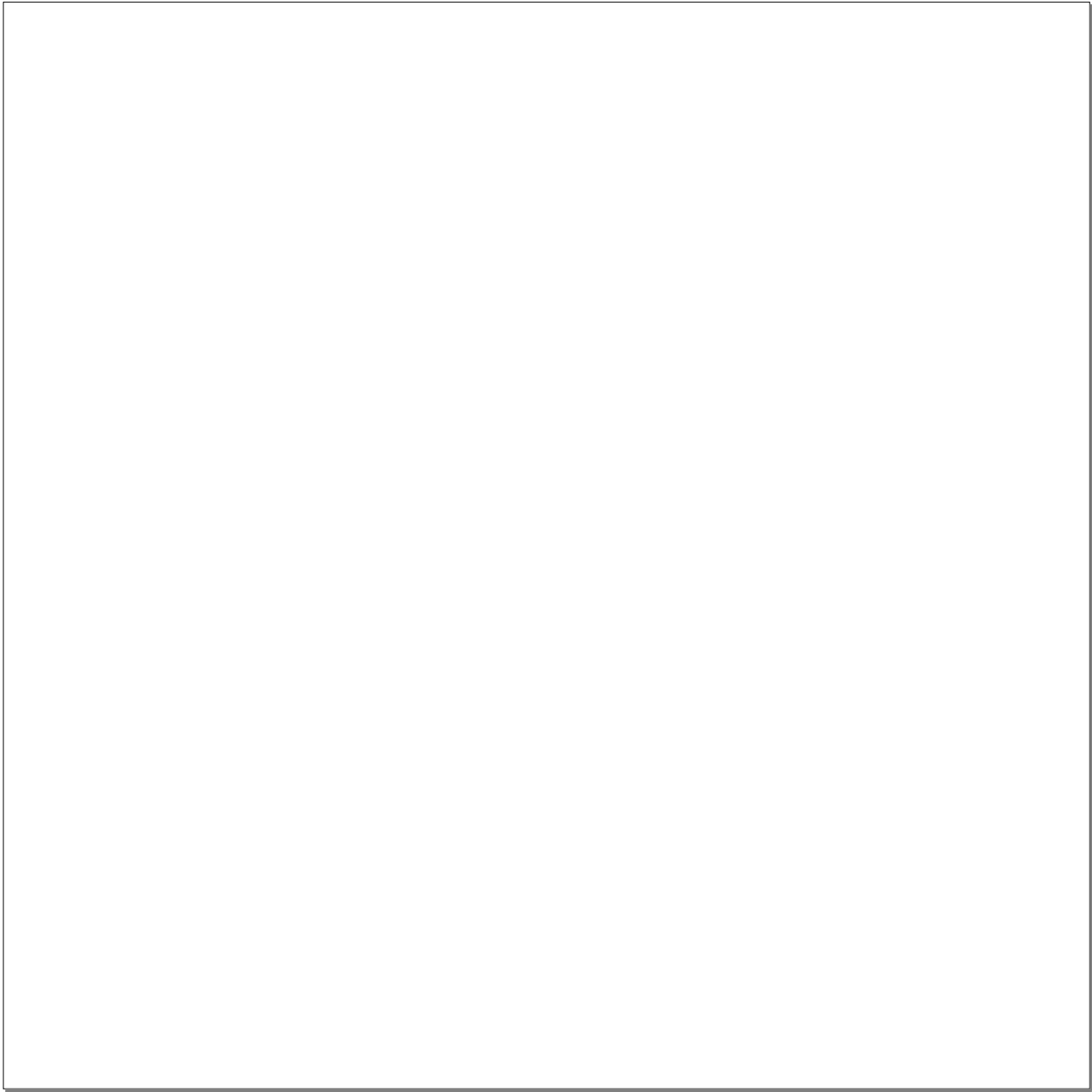

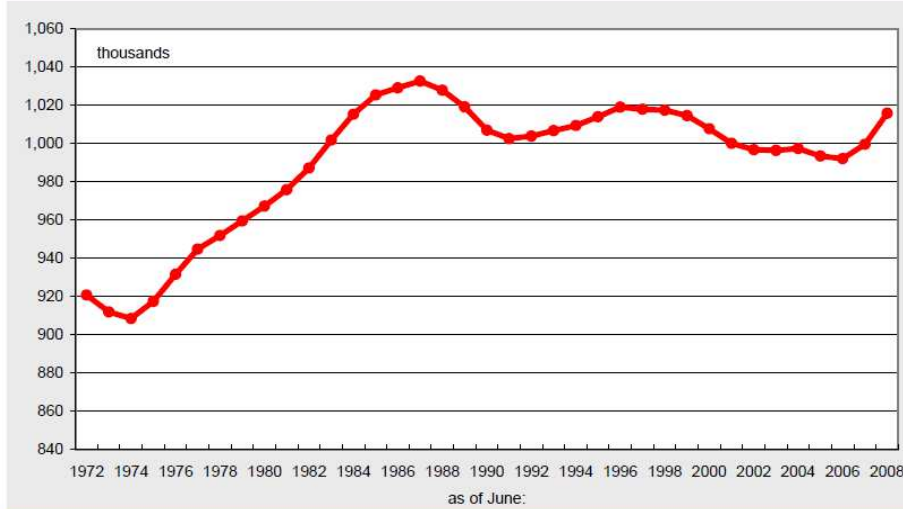

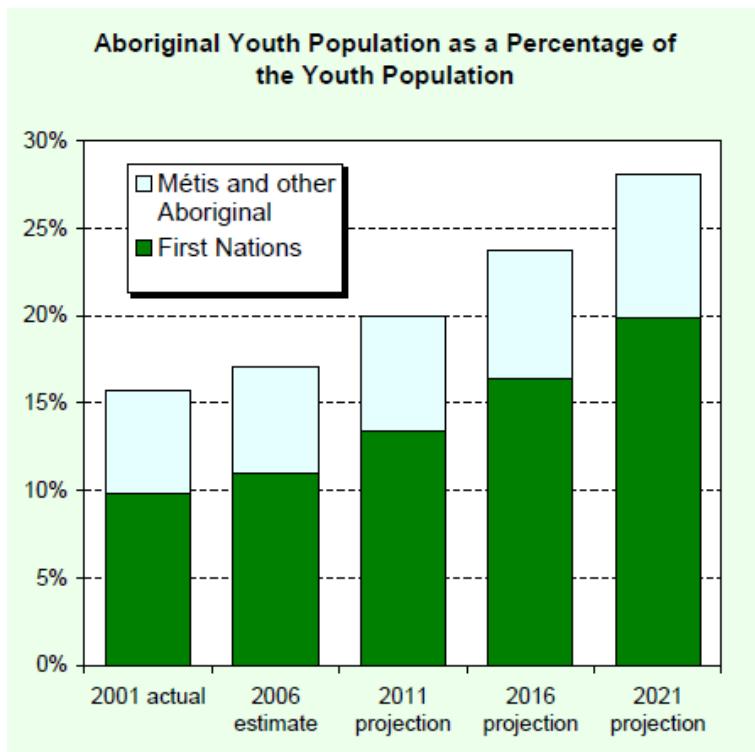
Figure 3.4 Saskatchewan Population, 1972 to 2008

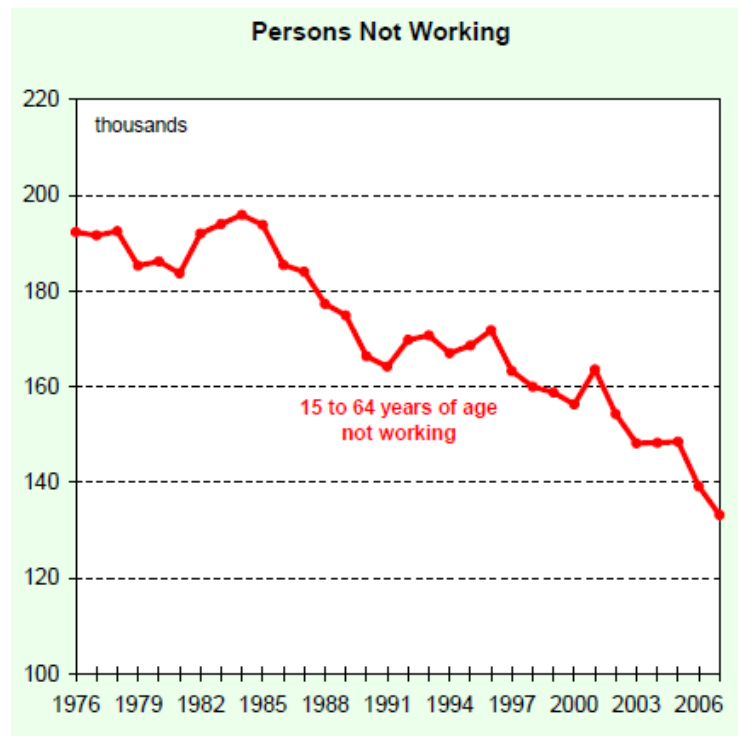

Employment is growing relatively more quickly:

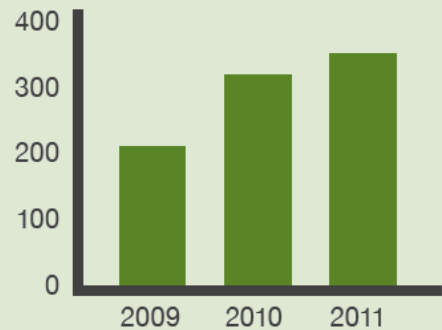
- among women;

Employment is growing relatively more quickly:

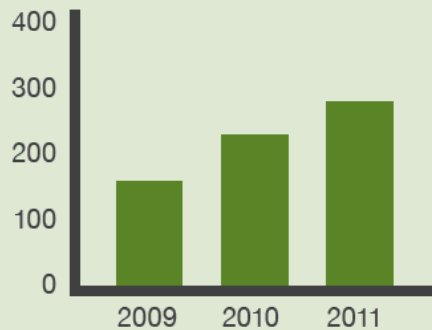
- in full-time permanent paid positions;

Prince Albert Police Service

DOWNTOWN VISIBILITY & REDUCED CRIME

The Prince Albert Police Service partnered with the Downtown Business Improvement District and Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming to provide a more visible Bylaw and Police presence in the downtown core. This initiative resulted in a safer area and educated vendors on the responsible sale of alcohol. The service also partnered with the Gabriel Dumont Institute to offer a summer student program which allowed two recent graduates of the Aboriginal Police Preparation Program to work with foot patrol and Bylaw officers. As a result of these initiatives, crime in the downtown area was reduced by 24% during the summer months.



BUILDING PARTNERSHIPS TO REDUCE CRIME

In February Community Mobilization Prince Albert (CMPA) was officially kicked off and has provided some very positive results. This initiative is a multi-agency team that addresses individuals and families who are at risk of victimization or living in unhealthy conditions. It is a preventative and collaborative approach to improving our community. Early indications of success include a 14.7% decrease in overall crime in addition to positive results seen by Police and departments such as Social Services and Health. The unit also focuses on root causes of crime and will look for long term solutions to local community challenges.

SUPPORTING THE SPCA

The City of Prince Albert and the Prince Albert SPCA entered a historic agreement in June 2011 which saw funding for the SPCA increase by 2.6 times from \$80,000 to \$213,000 annually by 2014. The funding is based on fee-for-service rather than the grant system used previously and will be phased in over a four year period. The funding commitment from the City allows the SPCA to focus entirely on the business of managing the pet population in Prince Albert and constructing a new shelter.

KINSMEN WATER PARK

The Kinsmen Water Park celebrated its 25th anniversary in 2011. As one of Saskatchewan's largest outdoor water parks, it remains one of the most accessible with rates increasing only an average 12 cents a year since it opened in 1986. For 25 years, the Water Park has served the Prince Albert community and surrounding area and remains one of the most fun-filled ways to stay active during the hot summer months. In 2011, the Kinsmen Water Park had 37,904 people come through its doors, a 16% increase over 2010. The popular Toonie night program was up 47% with a total of 5985 taking advantage of the program. Swimming lessons were also up 15% from 2010 with 409 registered users.

Improving the methods the City's uses to share information with residents became a formal priority in 2011 through the approval of a Strategic Communications Plan. The plan outlines key initiatives to pursue that will assist in the effective delivery of information to residents. This includes initiatives such as a review of social media options, broadcasting Council meetings online and improved website content.

Good communication is as much about good governance by ensuring residents are informed and engaged in the civic issues that affect their lives as it is about good customer service. Improving the methods the City uses to share timely and useful information about day-to-day services like swimming lesson registrations and garbage pickup schedules is simply good service.

Areas of improved customer service in 2011 include:

PAYMENTS AND POINTS OF PURCHASE

- Introduction of online payment options for property taxes through financial institutions
- New Metercards for downtown parking meters that allow patrons of the downtown another convenient payment option
- Introduction of online bookings for the Cooke Municipal Golf Course.
- Increased the number of transit ticket vendors throughout the City so riders have more convenient points to purchase bus tickets/passes.
- Introduction of payment option at Art Hauser Centre for rental services

SHARING INFORMATION

- New Fire and Emergency Services website that includes more comprehensive information and an RSS feed option for those looking for regular updates on Fire activities.
- Email subscription service for road closure and media release notifications from the City
- City's website has been updated to include Wedding and Special Event venues to provide a one-stop shop. Also added comprehensive information and virtual tours of the City's 10 community clubs including rental applications.

- Introduced a Facebook account for City's Recreation programming. Find the page under Prince Albert Sports Leagues, Fitness and Recreation.

- Television monitors were introduced at the Art Hauser Centre and Alfred Jenkins Fieldhouse to share information on upcoming programming offered by the City.

- Improved information available regarding aquatics on the City's website including monthly schedules for public, family, lane swimming and aquacise classes.

OTHER SERVICE IMPROVEMENTS

- Automatic re-registration at Alfred Jenkins Fieldhouse for regular program users as well as preparation of an information package for schools/groups, streamlining renewal letters, waiving lock fees for first day membership users, improving layout of website information and providing programming information for other City facilities.

City's concessions now offer new menu items including healthy options at the Alfred Jenkins Fieldhouse. Concessions also added vending units and ATMs at the Fieldhouse and Water Park and have updated the digital menu boards.

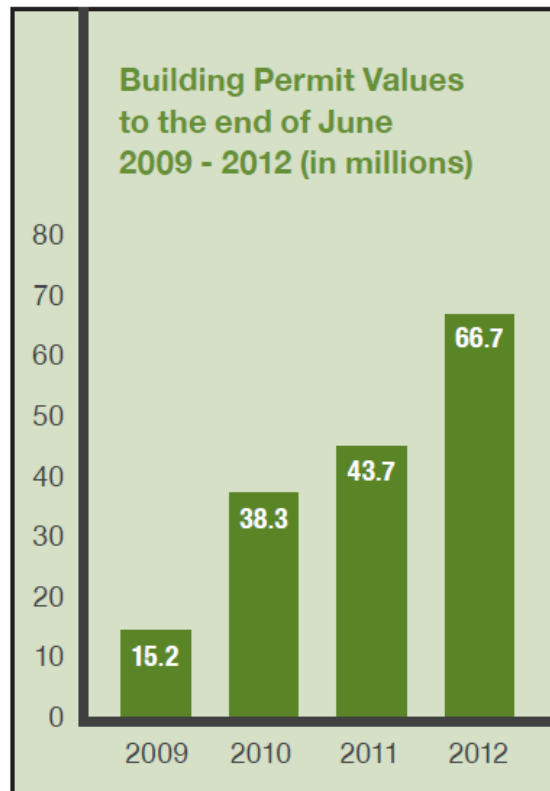

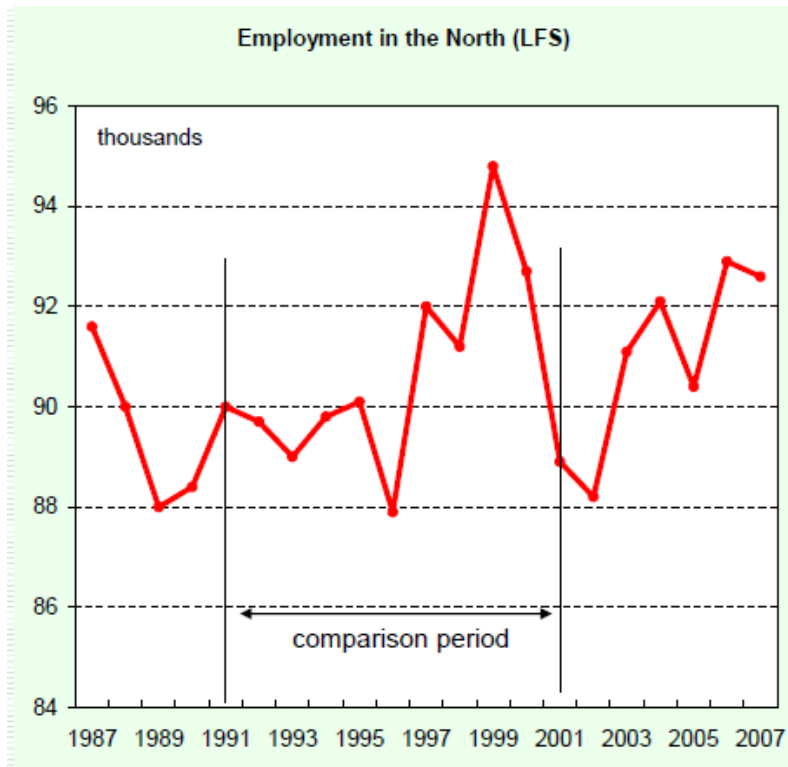

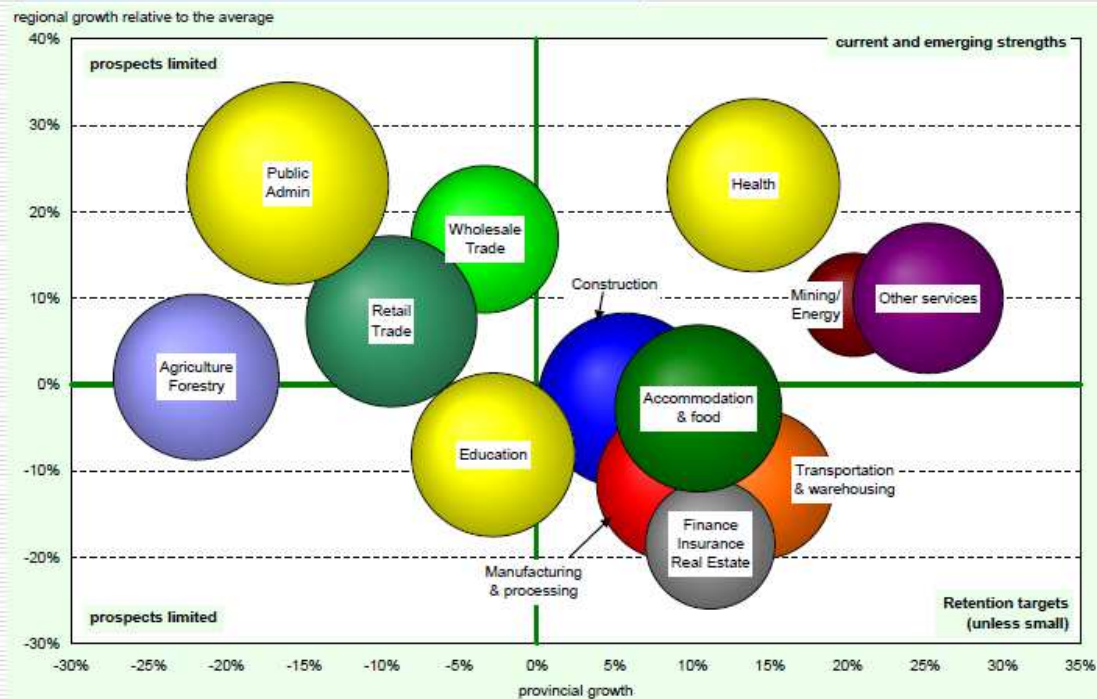
