ARE YOU INTERESTED IN BECOMING A CREE OR FRENCH LANGUAGE TEACHER?

The Language Teacher Education Program (LTEP) is a direct entry, four-year Bachelor of Education (BEd) degree program. Teacher candidates in this program will focus on Early/Middle Years (Prekindergarten to Grade 8) learners in immersion, bilingual, intensive and core settings.

Cree or French will be your Teaching Area 1 (or major) and you will be able to select one of the following as your Teaching Area 2 (or minor):

- Arts Education
- English Language Arts
- Indigenous Studies
- Mathematics
- Physical Education
- Science
- Social Sciences/Social Studies

Be immersed in Cree or French in your coursework and field experiences to improve your language proficiency and methodological prowess. Courses in this new program focus on second language pedagogy, curricula, planning and assessment.

Participate in four different field experiences throughout Years 2, 3 and 4 of the program.

Exchange opportunities and off-site learning experiences are being developed to complement the coursework and to give specific attention to culture, identity and language revitalization.



CREE STREAM

DEADLINES

Early admission: Dec. 1

If you are a high school student or recent graduate, you may be eligible for early admission. Early applicants who apply, pay the application fee and submit transcripts and other admission documents by December 1 and have an admission average of 80% or greater will be offered early admission.

Competitive ranking-based admission: Feb. 15

Applicants who do not meet the early admission average or who apply between December 1 and the regular application deadline of February 15 will be ranked competitively by admission average and stream (e.g., Cree or French). Seats will be offered to the top applicants.

WorkSafe Saskatchewan Youth Video Contest 2022

WorkSafe Saskatchewan invites Saskatchewan students in grades 9 to 12 to create a two-minute video demonstrating workplace safety. The contest awards student and school cash prizes for the top three videos:

- 1st place – \$1,000 (student/team) and \$1,500 (school);
- 2nd place – \$750 (student/team) and \$1,000 (school); and,
- 3rd place – \$500 (student/team) and \$750 (school).

Deadline for submissions is 4 p.m. on March 25, 2022. Saskatchewan's first-place winner will advance to the national youth video contest hosted by the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety.
