HOW TO EMAIL A TEACHER





Why Are You Emailing? Tell the teacher why you are emailing them. Include any relevant details.

Examples:

"I am emailing because... "I can't find..." "Can you please help me with..."



Subject Line

Your subject line should be a short summary of your email (2-6 words).

Examples:

"Missing Assignments" "Technical Difficulties" "Late Work"

End Your Email Close your email with a simple goodbye.

Examples:

Thank you for your help. "Have a nice day. "See you in class."



Say Hello Just like you would in person, say "Hello" first.

Examples:

"Hi [Name]," "Good morning, Mrs. Gracey," "Greetings!"



Include Your Name Nomes are important, including yourst Let's use it.

After ending your email, do not forget to sign your name.
