

Subject Line

Your subject line should be a short summary of your email (2-6 words).

Examples:

Missing Assignments
Technical Difficulties
Late Work



Say Hello

Just like you would in person, say "Helio" first.

Examples:

"Hi [Name]." "Good morning, Mrs. Gracey," "Greetings!"



To: myteacher@myschool.org Subject: Missing Assignment

Good Morning,

I am emailing you because I have already turned in my book report. However, it still shows that I am missing the assignment in the grade book. Can you tell me if you have received it?

Thank you for checking on this.

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Why Are You Emailing?

Tell the teacher why you are emailing them. Include any relevant details.

Examples:

"I am emailing because..."
"I can't find..."
"Can you please help me with..."

End Your Email

Close your email with a simple goodbye.

Examples:

Thank you for your help."
Have a nice day.
"See you in class."



YOU MUST HAVE A CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE LETTER FROM POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION TO APPLY

- 1. Look on post- secondary websites for scholarships
- 2. Explore these websites <u>www.yconic.com</u> and <u>www.studentawards.com</u>
- 3. Watch Carlton tvs
- 4. Look at wall outside Student Services beneath tv for scholarship info
- 5. School scholarships posted mid April



Education Scholarships

Each year, the Saskatchewan School Boards Association awards two \$2,500 scholarships to graduating Saskatchewan high school students:

- Degree Program Scholarship: \$2,500
- Technical/Trade Program Scholarship: \$2,500

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of demonstrated good character, community leadership, financial need and a 500-word essay. The application deadline is Aug. 31 each year.



WORKSHOP OVERVIEW

What is this Self-Advocacy workshop and why are we promoting it?

The Saskatchewan Advocate for Children and Youth (SACY) places a significant emphasis on raising awareness about young people's rights. One of our main areas of focus over the coming years is to work with children and youth to encourage the development of self-advocacy skills: to speak up or act to improve their own quality of life, to effect personal change, or to make things more equal or fair. In this workshop we teach young citizens of Saskatchewan to self-advocate, which supports their right to be heard and have their opinions considered when decisions are being made about their lives!

Speak for Yourself workshop key topics include:

- Self-Advocacy What it is and how to use it
- Know Yourself Explore your strengths, challenges, needs and much more.
- Know your Rights and Responsibilities Learn about Rights, Needs, Wants and Responsibilities and about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child
- Effective Communication Learn about communication approaches, and ways to communicate with professionals to be effective in the self-advocacy process

What does this workshop look like?

- The workshop lasts 2 hours
- We can tailor it to ages 8-16
- It is interactive, positive and fun, with activities, games and group discussion
- Each participant receives their own copy of our Speak for Yourself guide
- SACY staff maintain the confidentiality of any information that they receive during a workshop, unless a specific exception applies




Do you want to earn some volunteer hours?
